This seminar will specifically focus on buprenorphine treatment of opioid use disorder in an office-based setting. The standard Provider Clinical Support System (PCSS) will be presented and will qualify for the first half of training to receive the DATA 2000 buprenorphine waiver.





OBJECTIVES

- describe regulations for buprenorphine treatment of opioid use disorder
- discuss how buprenorphine's unique pharmacology affects its clinical use
- explain the risks of buprenorphine diversion and misuse
- present data related to buprenorphine treatment outcomes and side effects, with comparison to methadone
- perform a typical history and physical appropriate to buprenorphine induction.
- diagnose opioid use disorder and comorbid substance use and psychiatric disorders
- explain potential contraindications to buprenorphine treatment
- provide a detailed description of the buprenorphine induction process
- discuss typical practice for buprenorphine maintenance
- compare naltrexone with buprenorphine for specific patient populations
