Travel Logistics

Hotel

A block of rooms is being held for Monday and Tuesday nights, April 15 and 16, at the Four Points by Sheraton Manhattan hotel, 530 Richards Dr., Manhattan, KS 66502. Note: Pay attention to the hotel’s cancellation policy, as KHC will not reimburse unused rooms.

Participants are encouraged to arrive by 6:00 p.m., Monday, April 15, to participate in an optional evening learning session, as well as for registration to open at 7:30 a.m. on Tuesday.

Travel Expense Reimbursement

Each Kansas hospital and ambulatory care setting located more than 50 miles from the meeting site is eligible for travel reimbursement to cover one hotel room for up to two nights at the designated hotel at the special group rate, as well as roundtrip mileage for one vehicle at the federal rate, up to \$100. Critical Access Hospitals are not subject to the 50-mile minimum distance for reimbursement eligibility. The Kansas Healthcare Collaborative will provide an expense reimbursement form upon conclusion of the Boot Camp to eligible participants. No food or incidental expenses will be covered.
