Hotel

Travel Expense Reimbursement

If your hospital is a participant in the KHC HIIN and is located more than 50 minutes from the meeting site, travel expense reimbursement may be available through the Kansas Healthcare Collaborative. This reimbursement could cover one night at the designated hotel at the discounted rate, as well as roundtrip mileage at the federal rate, up to \$100, for the first 40 eligible hospitals.
