

KHC Clinic Assistance Program

For Small and/or Rural Kansas Practices

Technical Assistance

KHC Quality Improvement Advisors (QIAs) will provide, virtual or on-site visits to small or rural clinics who demonstrate a need for assistance. KHC staff will help educate and empower the clinic staff by assessing the immediate needs for education, training, and resources so that the clinic may sustain operations and comply with state and federal conditions of participation. Assistance is customized to meet the unique clinic needs.

Clinic Leader Lunch and Learn Series

KHC facilitates a virtual education series for clinic leaders to increase their knowledge and network with other Kansas leaders. Sessions cover topics such as CMS QPP, Quality 101, RHC Basics, RHC Survey and Certification Readiness, Credentialing and Licensure, Loss Prevention Coverage and Claims, AR Benchmarking and Reporting, Provider Recruitment and Retention, Infection Prevention and Control, HIT and Important Resources for Clinics.

Quality Improvement Mini-Grants

Participants in the Lunch and Learn Series may apply for grants to support innovative projects such as Population Health Technology, Patient Self-Monitoring for Chronic Disease (Heart Failure and High BP), MAT Waiver Training for Providers, Community Health Workers, Chronic Care Management, Suicide Prevention, Diabetes Management, Care Transitions including use of HIE/KHIN, Substance Abuse Disorder and Overdose Prevention. Allowable Expenses may include but are not limited to Training, Staff Time, Supplies and Materials, Medical Equipment Including DME for Self-Monitoring, and Software/IT.
