

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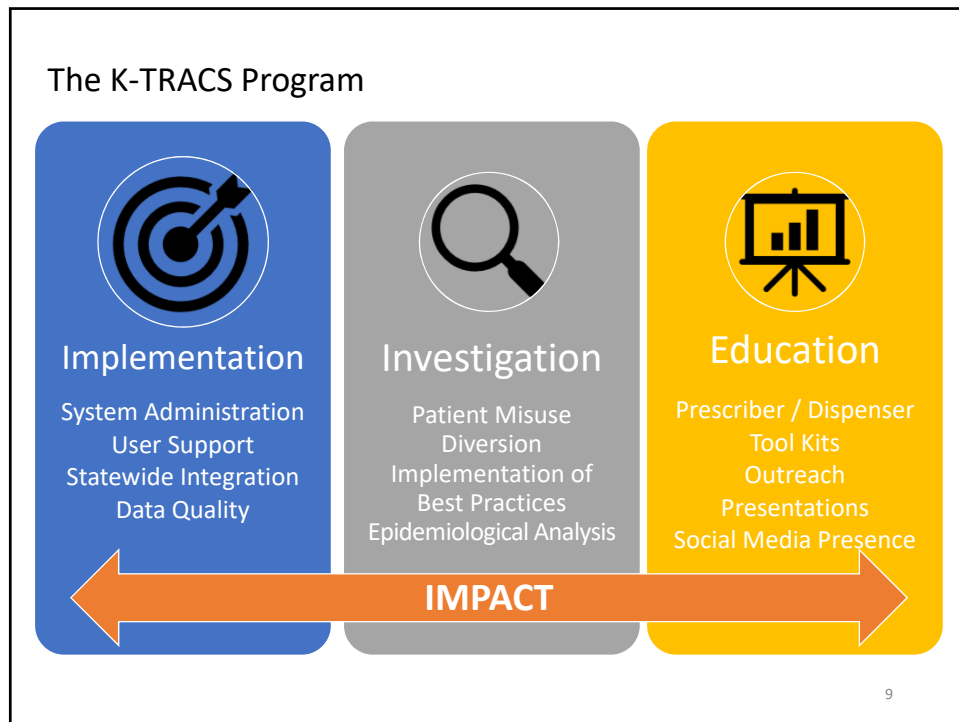

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Why Use K-TRACS?

- K-TRACS helps with clinical decision-making by providing patient's controlled prescription history which results in better outcomes and can ultimately save lives.
- K-TRACS can be used to prevent Misuse, Abuse and Diversion.
- K-TRACS helps identify patients for assessment and treatment of potential substance use disorder.

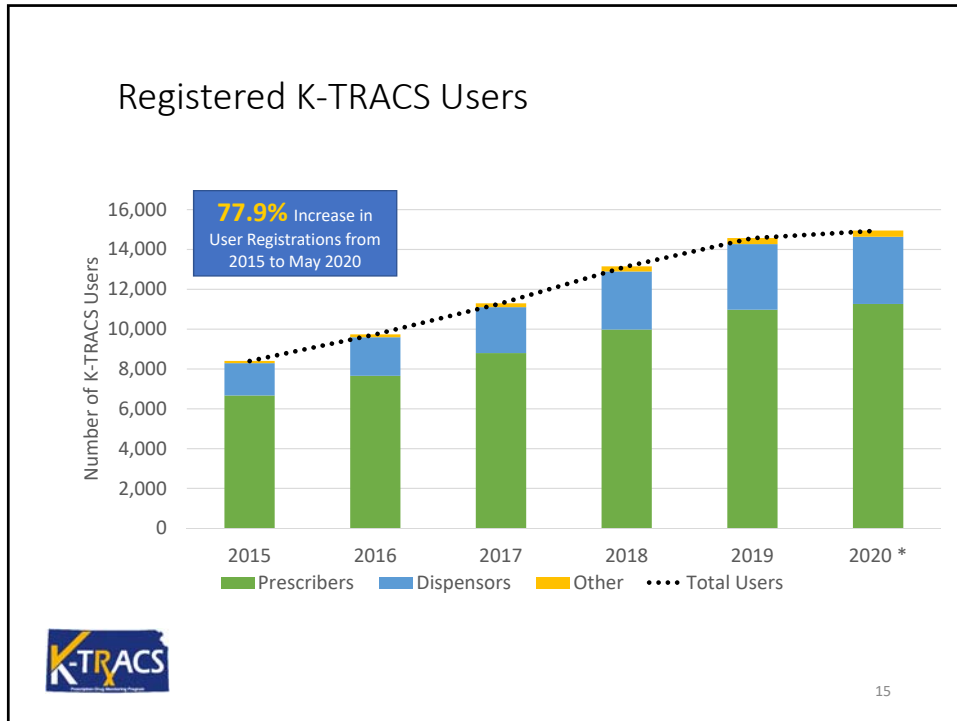
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Delegate Registration

- www.kansas.pmpaware.net/login
- Delegates MUST use their work email address.
- Delegates MUST have their supervising prescriber's DEA number and email address the prescriber used when registering.
- Once the delegate has submitted all information the supervising prescriber will receive an email to approve the individual.
- Currently delegates include RNs, LPNs and Pharmacy Technicians.
- Listed as Prescribers Delegate-License and Pharmacy Delegate-Licensed.
- If a delegate is terminated or resigns please notify the K-TRACS office immediately at pmpadmin@ks.gov



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Statewide Integration

- Integration with electronic health records
 - Improve access, patient support and engagement, and care coordination
 - Reduce barriers
 - Increase utilization of K-TRACS – 7-fold increase in queries
- State covers all PDMP Gateway® connection costs for each Kansas healthcare entity approved for integration
- 794 integrated as of September 2019

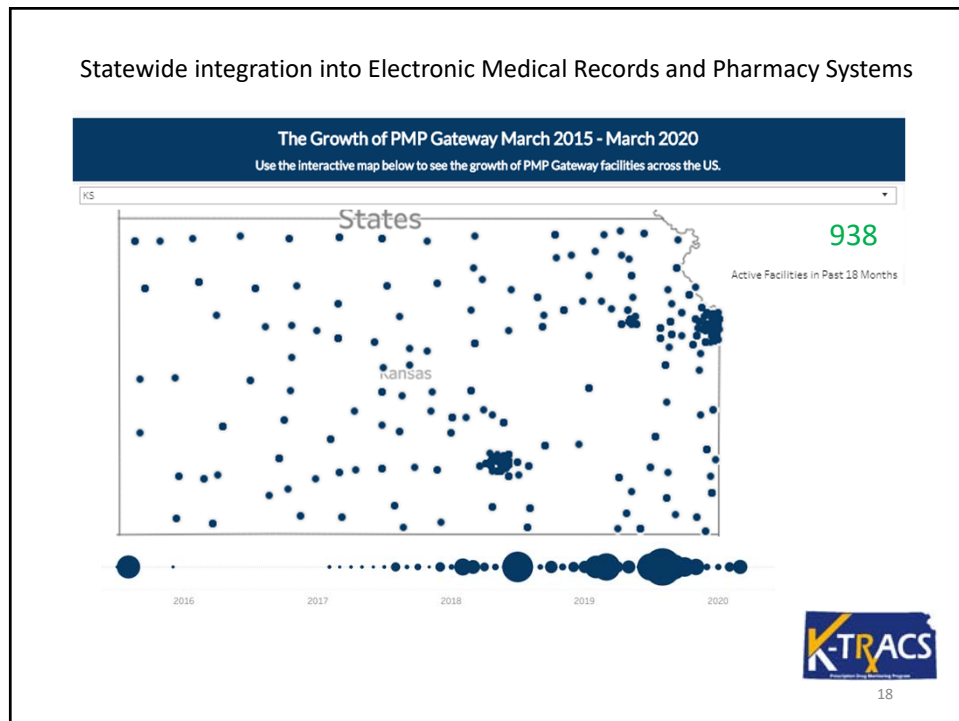
Provide quality improvement reimbursement.



Shift the time to query the PDMP to clinical work time

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PERx-Prescribers E-Recap

- Snapshot of your prescribing practice.
- Released quarterly and covers the prior six months.
- How many patients you have prescribed opioids and compares to others in your specialty.
- MME ranges.
- Opioid Treatment duration.
- How many times you and your delegate(s) have queried the system.
- Multiple Provider Episode (MPE) provide a look at the number of your patients who have met or exceeded the K-TRACS threshold.
- Dangerous Combination Therapy provides you with details of your patient's combination therapies that may increase a patient's risk for overdose.

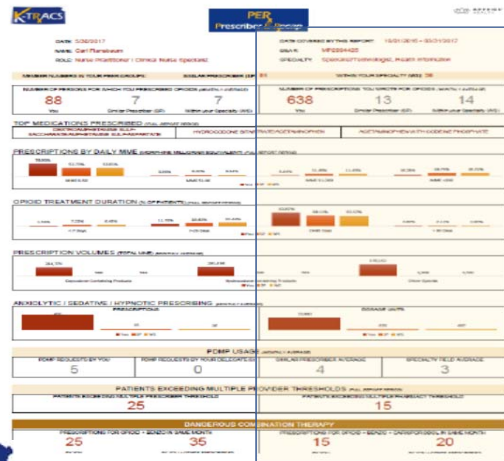

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PERx Report

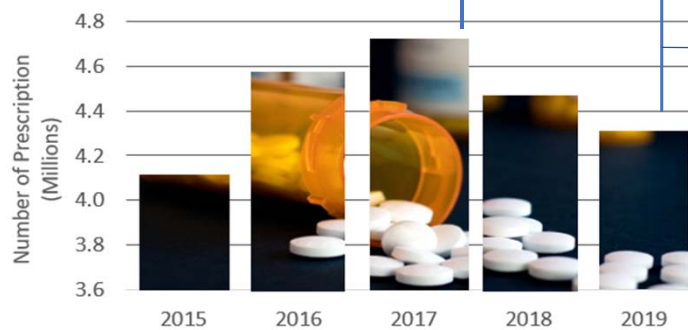


Compares individual prescribing habits to the average of peers within a specialty (example – all family practice prescribers)



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Total Controlled Substance Prescription in K-TRACS Kansas Prescribers / Kansas Dispensers (2015-2019)

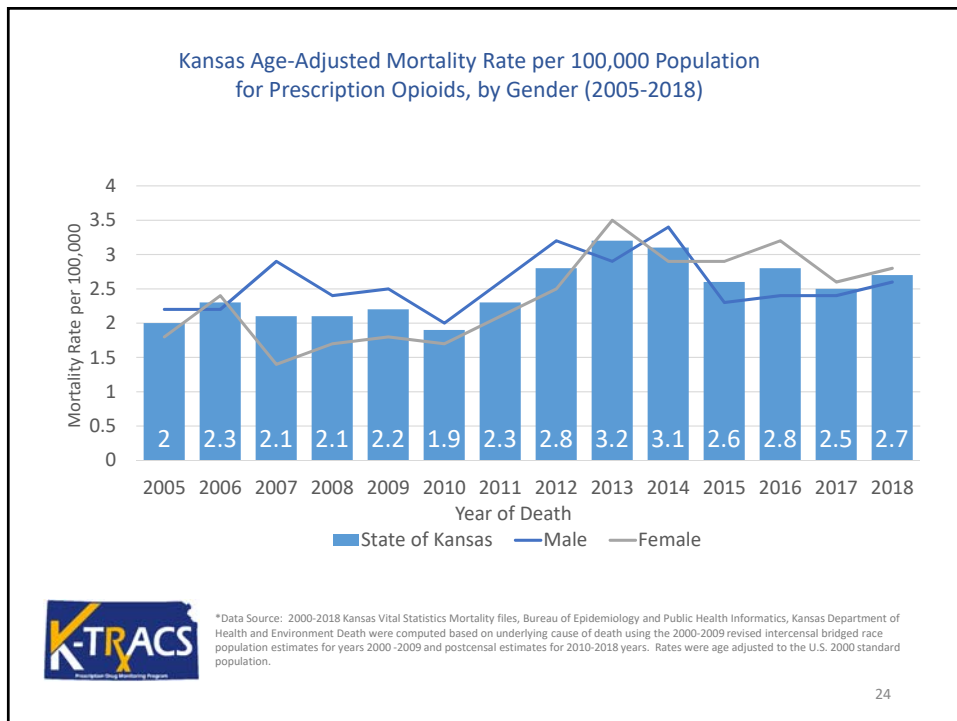
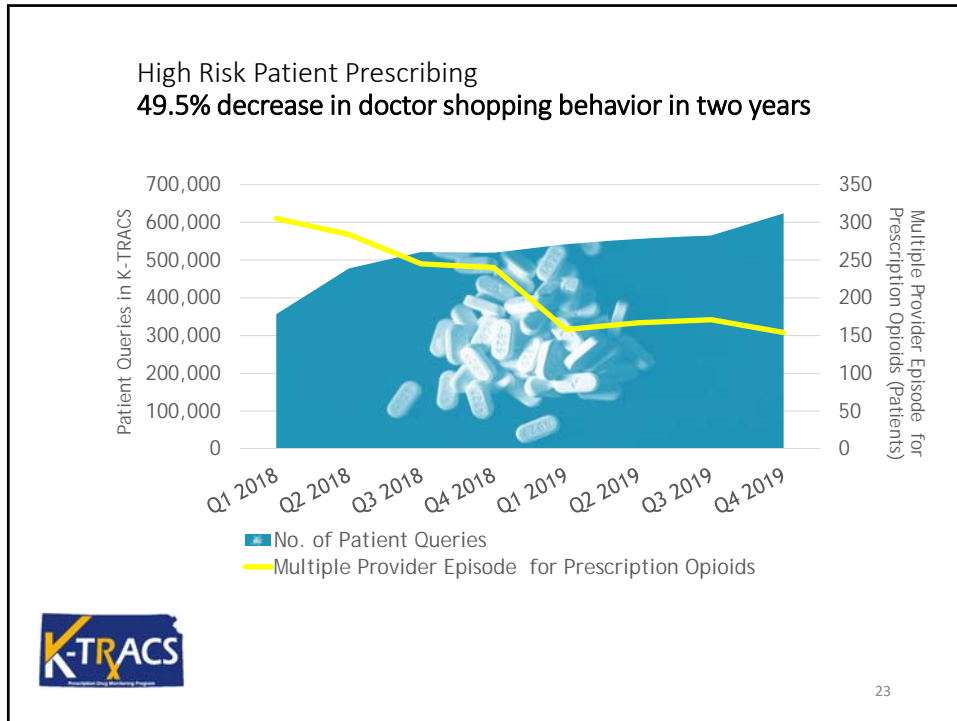


8.5% decrease from 2017 to 2019 in dispensations



6.4% fewer controlled substances were prescribed in Kansas in the first half of 2020 compared to the same time period in 2019. (partial year 2020 data is not displayed)

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Upcoming proposed changes to the PMP Act

- Defines “Delegate” with in the PMP Act
- Allows de-identified data to be provided for research purposes
- Defines data retention and storage (Removes the 5-year limit)
- Allows for the collection of additional PDMP components:
 - Date of death
 - Fact of death
 - Clinical notes
 - Overdose events
 - Naloxone dispensing and/or administration

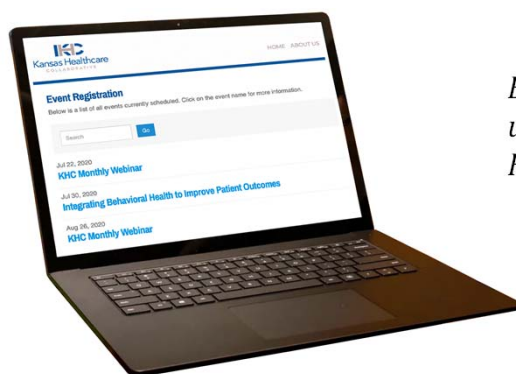
