Summit on Quality Speakers



Corey Ciocchetti

Serving as the Bill Daniels Professor of Business Ethics and Legal Studies at the University of Denver, Corey Ciocchetti is one of the University's most popular and highest-rated professors. Corey earned a law degree from Duke University School of Law, as well as master's degree in Religious Studies and two bachelor's degrees in Finance and Economics from the University of Denver.

Corey is a talented speaker and teacher and has won multiple teaching and speaking awards including the Outstanding Professor of the Year Award and the Joel Goldman Award for most respected speaker on the CAMPUSPEAK roster. He currently teaches classes on business law and ethics in a department ranked by the Wall Street Journal and Business Week in the top ten nationwide for producing students with high ethical standards.

Corey speaks to tens of thousands of individuals each year about "authentic success" and living an ethical life. He is the author of the book *Inspire Integrity: Chase An Authentic Life*. He has spoken to diverse audiences in over 250 cities and 47 states over the past ten years. A Colorado native, Corey resides in Denver with his wife and two daughters.

Malea Hartvickson is the Kansas Healthcare Collaborative's Executive Director.
