



# Let's ReBoot: Examining Strategies to Reset Culture + Practices Around CLABSI Reduction

### Overview

The focus of this webinar is to help hospitals reset their culture of infection prevention to tackle the rising CLABSI rates related to the COVID-19 pandemic. This webinar begins with connecting the nurse advocacy role with reducing harm through several different strategies. It will also address issues around indications for insertion, guidance on the proper catheter selections and brief review of evidence and process around insertion. At the end of the webinar participants will be asked to work through a small test of change regarding a practice area that needs improvement.

- + Identify what has been learned through the pandemic that can be used to reboot CLABSI initiatives
- + Discuss strategies for getting back to basics and resetting the culture of safety

### Overview

The second webinar will go beyond the guidelines for CLABSI to address some of the challenging areas of the maintenance bundles including ensuring daily discussion of removal, dressing disruption, variation in bathing practices and blood culture contamination. Strategies for overcoming those challenges will be outlined.
