Self-Management Education

The self-management education workshops series is offered 2.5 hours, once a week, for six weeks in locations that can include provider offices and community settings. Health consumers, their family members and/or caregivers attend the program together. Workshops are facilitated by two trained leaders, one or both of whom have a chronic condition. Sessions are highly participative, where mutual support and success builds participants confidence in their ability to manage their health and maintain active and fulfilling lives.

Works With Existing Treatment Plans

The workshop series will **not** conflict with existing programs or treatment. It is designed to enhance regular treatment and disease-specific education. Many health consumers have more than one chronic condition and this program is especially helpful for these consumers, as it gives them the skills to coordinate all the things needed to manage their health and to keep them active in their lives.

This evidence-based workshop is part of the Self-Management Programs developed by Stanford University's Division of Family & Community Medicine, School of Medicine.
