


Like HIV/AIDS or diabetes, opioid use disorder is a chronic condition managed using medication as a component of care.



ECHO uses video-conferencing technology to offer mentoring.

Connect from your computer, with a webcam and microphone, a tablet or smart phone to gain access to case-based learning and interdisciplinary teams.



#### Tele-ECHO Model

- Collaborative medical education
- Democratize and de-monopolize medical knowledge linking interdisciplinary specialty team with multiple primary care clinicians
- Experts mentor and share their expertise across a virtual network

- Acquire new skills and competencies
